MINUTES ELKHART COUNTY COUNCIL April 11, 2015

The meeting of the Elkhart County Council was called to order by Sheriff Brad Rogers at 8:00 a.m., in Room 104 of the County Administrative Building, Goshen, Indiana. Members present were President John K. Letherman, Vice President David L. Hess, David E. Foutz, Randall D. Yohn, David M. Ashe, Darryl J. Riegsecker and Thomas W. Stump.

Also present were Pauline Graff, County Auditor; Craig Buche, County Attorney; Gordon Lord, County Attorney; Mike Yoder, County Commissioner; and Tom Byers, County Administrator.

MINUTES: Approval of minutes for March 14, 2015.

On motion made by Riegsecker seconded by Stump and unanimously carried, the minutes were approved as received.

EDC MATTERS:

Second Reading on Universal Trailer Bond Ordinance CC-2015-06.

Letherman has conflict, Hess conducting the hearing.

An Ordinance Authorizing The Issuance And Sale Of An Aggregate Principal Amount Not To Exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) Of Elkhart County, Indiana Economic Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2015 (Universal Trailer Project); Designating The Bonds As Limited Obligations Of The County; Approving Th3e Form Of, And Authorizing The Execution And Delivery Of, The Bond And Loan Agreement And Other Documents Related To The Issuance And Sale Of The Bonds; And Authorizing Proper Officers To Do All Other Things Deemed Necessary Or Advisable In Connection Therewith And Approving And Authorizing Other Actions In Respect Thereto.

3. County Health Operating (1159-340-41115): Request reclassification of one Clerical Supervisor II (Peacock), PG4/JF6, to Clerical Supervisor III, PG5/JF6, with 6% promotional increase to \$1342.68, effective 4-19-15.

On motion made by Yohn and seconded by Lucchese, the CCPC unanimously approved this request, 4-0.

On motion made by Foutz seconded by Stump and unanimously carried, the Council approved this request.

4. County Health Operating/Tobacco Settlement (1206-980/981): Request reclassification of one Health Promotion Specialist (Priest), PG6/JF5, to one Public Health Coordinator (new), PG7/JF5, \$19.16/hr, effective 4-5-15.

On motion made by Yohn and seconded by Lucchese, the CCPC unanimously approved this request, 4-0.

On motion made by Foutz seconded by Ashe and unanimously carried, the Council approved this request.

5. Indiana Tobacco Prevention and Cessation (9104-981-41140): Request one new regular part time Health Education Assistant, PG4/JF1, \$14.25/hr, effective 7-1-15, with grant approval.

On motion made by Lucchese and seconded by Yohn, the CCPC unanimously approved this request, 4-0.

On motion made by Hess seconded by Stump and unanimously carried, the Council approved this request.

D. Park Department

1. Park and Recreation (1219-320-41150): Request two additional Park Services I positions, PG2/JF2, \$11.99/hr, effective 4-19-15.

On motion made by Stump and seconded by Lucchese, the CCPC unanimously denied this request, 4-0, with the recommendation to use part time people initially and return to CCPC in a year to see if full time can be justified based on fees collected.

On motion made by Hess seconded by Stump and unanimously carried, the Council denied this request.

2. Park and Recreation (1219-320-41150): Request individual rate increase for Park Services I (Bowen and Kunde), PG2/JF2, \$12.55. Due to a misunderstanding of the County policy on hiring ranges by then-management staff, this request is intended to compensate these two individuals with the rate they were offered at 6 months when they accepted the position. The effective date for Bowen is 12/14/2014 (first pay period of the year) and the effective date for Kunde is 2/8/2015 (6 month anniversary).

Finally, \$20,000 is for the County Road 17 boat launch area, specifically for one time maintenance and provide County Highway with financial assistance for construction of the pier.
